Consideration and action on Resolution # EDC 2021-06, amending the 2020/2021 Budget for the Copperas Cove Economic Development Corporation (CCEDC). **Diane Drussell, Interim Director, Copperas Cove EDC**

Description/Information:

The 2020/2021 Budget was adopted by City Council on August 4, 2020.

Per Section 9 of the CCEDC Bylaws, "Capital Project Funds may be used in a manner prescribed by the Board of Directors for a major capital outlay, capital improvement, land acquisition or other items allowed by Texas Law". And per Section 10, "If at any time the budget needs to be amended through an increase, a majority vote of the Board of Directors and approval of the Unit will be required".

In November 2020, an amendment was approved for a capital expenditure necessary to run gas lines to the Narrows Business and Technology Park.

The CCEDC is now requesting a second amendment be approved.

The CCEDC requires an overall expenditure increase of \$124,163 to reimburse the city for the local match for the installation of the sidewalks in the Narrows. The Funding Agreement for this project was presented to (and approved by) City Council by the City Manager for approval on Sept. 7, 2021.

Financial Impact:

Overall increase of \$124,163 for the FY 2020/2021 (Amended) EDC Budget.

Action/Recommendation:

EDC staff requests BOD approve Resolution # EDC 2021-06, a budget amendment in the amount not to exceed \$124,163 for the local match, for the installation of sidewalks in the Narrows Business and Technology Park. Upon approval, this item will be presented to City Council (November 2, 2021) for final approval.

RESOLUTION NO. EDC 2021-06

A RESOLUTION OF THE COPPERAS COVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION APPROVING AND ADOPTING AN AMENDMENT TO THE BUDGET FOR OPERATING THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2020, AND ENDING ON SEPTEMBER 30, 2021; REPEALING ALL RESOLUTIONS AND APPROPRIATIONS IN CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS RESOLUTION; AND ESTABLISHING A SAVINGS CLAUSE AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

- WHEREAS, the Copperas Cove Economic Development Corporation desires to amend the operating budget of the Economic Development Corporation for the fiscal year October 1, 2020 to September 30, 2021; and
- WHEREAS, said budget amendments have been submitted to the Economic Development Corporation Board by the Economic Development Director in accordance with the bylaws.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COPPERAS COVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION:

SECTION I.

That the Copperas Cove Economic Development Corporation approve and adopt the amendments to the budget considered for the fiscal year of October 1, 2020 to September 30, 2021, as identified in "Exhibit A" of this resolution.

SECTION II.

That all resolutions for which provision has heretofore been made are hereby expressly repealed if in conflict with the provisions of this resolution.

SECTION III.

That should any part, portion, or section of this resolution be declared invalid or inoperative or void for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision, opinion or judgment shall in no way affect the remaining portions, parts, or sections or parts of section of this resolution, which provisions shall be, remain and continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION IV.

That this resolution shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

Information and presentation by Carlton Schwab of the Texas Economic Development Council (TEDC) on Type 4A Economic Development Organizations. **Diane Drussell, Interim Director, Copperas Cove EDC**

The Development Corporation Act of 1979 gives cities the ability to finance new and expanded business enterprises in their local communities through economic development corporations (EDCs). Chapters 501, 504 and 505 of the Local Government Code outline the characteristics of Type A and Type B EDCs, authorize cities to adopt a sales tax to fund the corporations and define projects EDCs are allowed to undertake.

In 1990, during a regular election, the citizens of Copperas Cove voted to create the Copperas Cove Economic Development Corporation (CCEDC). The CCEDC a Type 4 A organization.

Over the years there has been confusion and misunderstanding on what a Type 4 A can and cannot do. In an effort for the Board of Directors, City Council and the overall community to better understand this type of organization, a representative from the Texas Economic Development Council has been invited to speak to the CCEDC Board and to members of City Council.

Mr. Schwab will offer a presentation and is open to questions.
